Somewhere in all this we will have many other events and activities and we will celebrate Halloween at Memory Park by handing out goodies to the children, but there will be more information on that later.



Notes from the Lay Leader



We, Chino Valley United Methodist Church, (CVUMC) have a very important meeting coming up on November 19, 2016. It is called the Charge Conference. I would like to spend a few minutes showing some of the background for the conference and why it is so important to CVUMC.

The United Methodist Church has as one of its foundations, the tradition of "Connectionalism." It is defined in the Discipline as; "multi-leveled, global in scope, and local in thrust." Our connectionalism is not merely a linking of one charge conference to another. It is rather a vital web of interactive relationships."

We are connected by sharing a common tradition of faith, including our Doctrinal Standards and General Rules. (¶132)

Our District Superintendent will ask each of his 35 churches to call for a Charge Conference.

The term "Charge" comes from

the authority of our Bishop assigning his Pastors to a "Charge." Thus Pastor Keffer was assigned to our church and it is his Pastoral Charge.

Within the pastoral charge the basic unit in the connectional system of the UMC is the charge conference. The charge conference shall meet annually. It shall be the connecting link between the local church and the general Church. It shall have oversight of the church council.

The primary responsibilities of the charge conference in the annual meeting shall be to review and evaluate the total mission and ministry of the church, receive reports, and adopt objectives and goals recommended by the church council that are in keeping with the objectives of The United Methodist Church.

One of the most important duties of the charge conference is to elect the leaders of CVUMC.

To encourage broader participation by members of the church, the charge conference may be convened as the church conference, extending the vote to all professing members of the local church present. This is the important point for all of us as members of CVUMC. Come, be present, and support the members of the committees and the chairs that you elect.





FRIENDSHIP


Make this with — and for — a special friend.

What you need:

- Paper and pencil
- Scissors
- Cardboard
- Aluminum foil
- Tape
- Acrylic paint (red, blue, green)
 • Paintbrushes
- Permanent marker
- Twine
- A friend

What you do:

- 1. Trace a palm-sized heart in the center of the paper. Cut out the heart to use as a stencil.
- 2. Cover the cardboard with foil. Tape the heart stencil in the center.
- 3. Fill in the heart "hole" with red paint. Let dry. Remove stencil.
- 4. Cover your hand with blue paint, and make a handprint to one side of the heart. Cover your friend's hand with green paint and have him or her make a handprint to the other side of the heart. Let dry.
- 5. Write "FRIENDS" at the top.
- 6. On the back, tape twine to make a hanger.
