Lifeline Screening

Once again, Life Line Screening, a leading provider of community-based preventive health screenings, will offer their affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings at Chino Valley United Methodist Church on 1/8/2018. Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk; and a bone density screening, for men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis.

Register for a Wellness Package which includes 4 vascular tests and osteoporosis screening from \$149 (\$139 with our member discount). All five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete. Notes from the Lay Leader



In June 2017, while I was at Annual Conference, I passed by a room where there was a sign with Wesley's "Covenant Service" advertised. I became very interested in the service, thinking that our church should do the service some time. I began to do some research and found some interesting history.

In 1663, Richard Alleine, a Puritan, published, "A Vindication of Godliness in the Greater Strictness and Spirituality of It". In 1753, it was again published in John Wesley's "A Christian Library."

Wesley used one chapter, "The Application of the Whole," on Monday, August 11, 1755, in what probably was the first real celebration of the Covenant Service in the Methodist movement. Wesley found the service rich and meaningful, as expressed in his journal: "Many mourned before God, and many were comforted." (April 1756).

After the time of Wesley, several versions of the

Covenant Service were developed, gradually giving Wesley's material less place in the total service. The present service follows our basic pattern of worship, enables the congregation to participate more fully, and updates language. Most significantly, the liturgy, beginning with the Invitation, is taken directly from Wesley's service of 1780.

The heart of the service, focused in the Covenant Prayer, requires persons to commit themselves to God. This covenant is serious and assumes adequate preparation for and continual response to the covenant. The service has been modified over the years (Wesley's service was over three hours) and the following opening prayer has been added.

O God, Searcher of all our hearts, you have formed us as a people and claimed us for your own.

As we come to acknowledge your sovereignty and grace, and to enter anew into covenant with you, reveal any reluctance or falsehood within us.

Let your Spirit impress your truth on our inmost being, and receive us in mercy, for the sake of our Mediator, Jesus Christ,

who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

one God, for ever and ever. Amen. (DAVID TRIPP, ENGLAND, 20TH CENT.)

The service is used once a year, and as you read in the prayer, we are asked to commit ourselves to God and Jesus. With this prayer in mind commit yourself to God and this Church.

This set of letters spells "Christ" in Greek. It may be written using the Roman alphabet (from which the English alphabet descended), but is also often presented in Greek characters, as shown

here.





What you need:

- Wooden craft sticks
- Metallic paint (gold and silver)
- Paint brushes
- Jingle bells (gold and silver)
- Hot glue gun
- Metallic ribbon
- Scissors
- Adult help

What you do:

- 1. Paint half the sticks gold and half silver. Let dry.
- 2. Glue three bells to each stick.
- 3. Cut a six-inch piece of ribbon for each stick. Tie a bow and glue it to the noisemaker. Celebrate!
