Hello Church,

I pray that God touches our hearts in a very special way this day and every day. As I begin to write this article I am reminded of the words of St. Paul in the letter to the Romans... "so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another."

Fair Play

To be outnumbered two to one is not fair in our way of thinking. But, 450 to one! Wow, that is really not fair. We may need God's help in that one.

Elijah was that outnumbered, 450 to one. The 450 opponents of Elijah were the priests of Baal. God's people had been influenced by these priests to worship their false god, the god Baal, a god who was not a living god; a god who could neither hear nor answer prayers. Elijah, in order to put a stop to such idol worship, challenged the 450 priests of Baal to a contest on the top of Mt Carmel. An altar was made and wood for a fire was laid. "You can have the first turn," said Elijah. "If your god Baal is a true god, then ask him to send down fire from heaven and light the altar fire for you."

The priests of Baal called out to their god to light such a fire. All that morning, and until mid-day, they cried to him. They jumped up and down and became frantic as nothing was happening. All the time, Elijah must have been inwardly smiling. Perhaps this god was busy somewhere else, or perhaps he was sleeping, or away on a journey he suggested.

Then it was Elijah's turn. He dug a trench around the altar and filled it with water. He poured water on the altar and the wood. Then, in the evening Elijah prayed and fire came down from heaven and set fire to the wood and burned it up. This was Elijah's prayer: "Hear me, O Lord, hear me, that this people may know that thou art the Lord God." And, as a result of his prayer, the people saw that Elijah's God is the Lord of all.

False gods can come in many forms -- pleasure, money, materialism, popularity, and so on. The one true living God is the maker of heaven and earth, our Creator and Redeemer. He is the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. When we come to God through Jesus, then we discover Him to be a God indeed -- one who hears us when we pray and answers our prayers. We should be prepared to stand up for him as Elijah did, no matter what the odds are.

Greetings from the Finance Committee

We are approaching the end of

summer and personally, I will welcome the lower temperatures; it's been too hot!

There are several items that I want to bring attention to the church congregation:

First, the Finance committee has approved a new budget for 2020. It is very similar to the 2019 with only a few percent overall increase. Some of the increases are included to accommodate our new Pastor. Remember, Pastor Mike was at retirement age and joined Medicare, and since he was retired, the church did not have to pay into his retirement fund or full insurance. These payment decreases did help the church financially. However, since Pastor Clare is not in the same situation, we are now again making these payments for her as we have in the past for our non-retired Pastors.

Second, the church had an outside audit performed this year. There are some suggestions and recommendations that the church will consider, but there were no bookkeeping, accounting or office procedures violations. The church office staff and the church committees are continually looking at ways to improvement to our church operating procedures and policies.

Third, the Trustees subcommittee has created an Endowment Fund Policy. It is still under final review at the Conference, so hopefully in the future you will be hearing more on this and how the congregation can participate.

Fourth, our annual stewardship campaign will begin at the beginning of November and end just before Thanksgiving. We intend to have a guest speaker to open the campaign on Nov 3rd. More information will follow.
