# Hanging of the Greens



The hanging of the greens is a Western Christian ceremony in which many congregations and people adorn their churches with Advent and Christmas decorations.

This is done on or directly before the start of the Advent season, in preparation for Christmastide. The service involves the placement of evergreen vegetation in the church. Items such as the evergreen wreath, in Christianity, carry the religious symbolism of everlasting life, a theological concept within that faith. As such, during the liturgy, "Biblical passages and other readings help explain the significance of the holly, the cedar, the Advent wreath, the Chrismon tree, and any other special decorations". In the Western Christian world, the traditional day when Christmas decorations are removed is Twelfth Night.

We will decorate the church on Sunday, November 24, following the 11:00 am service. All are welcome!

### FOOD BANK AND ADOPT-A-FAMILY

It is amazing what God makes out of the loaves and fishes we have been lucky enough to gather through our recent fund-raiser. The Car Show event on September 28th allowed the community to support both the Food Bank and the Adopt-afamily project. We met many new participants and enjoyed the friendly atmosphere. This event allows us to help those who need food just to make it from day to day. In addition, we are able to provide a good Christmas for a couple of families.

I spoke to Rudy Salazar who manages the Food Bank. They provide food boxes for about 400 people per month. Although they regularly fill boxes from donated soup, tuna, canned beans and packaged beans, pasta, cereal, and other staples, these boxes are also supplemented with food from local fast food restaurants, grocery stores, and Dollar stores.

There are, however, many supplies that need to be purchased regularly. Examples: peanut butter, pasta, mac & cheese, and vegetables. Donations help the Food Bank to provide a stable supply of basic food items. Our donations will be used to stock the food bank with needed items. Loaves and fishes, Loaves and fishes.

Marilyn Jenkins has been our Adopt-a-family liaison with the school district. The Christmas tree, located in the Narthex last Christmas, had tags for the angels from our church who wished to help. This activity has helped to provide a need, a want, and a wish for each child on the tree. Thanks to the generosity of our congregation and the support of fundraisers like the car show, we were also able to pick up those tags that were not picked from the tree as well as providing gift cards to help the family with groceries, clothing and gas. Last year, we were able to help two sets of parents and six children have a blessed Christmas season. Blessings upon Blessings.

We all know someone who has been in need of assistance. Think how you would feel if you were on the receiving end of this generosity. God has blessed us and we are able to pay it forward. What better feeling could we have!
