

I happen to receive the communication letter from the Pacific North West Conference. This past week Rev. Kathy Neary wrote an article that struck me as very relevant to our church.

She titled it, "What makes a church a Church?"

I like to think of the word "church" in two ways.
First it is the physical plant, the building.
Secondly, and more importantly, I believe the term means the congregation, the people of the church. So, what is your definition?

Rev. Neary, "brings out some interesting points about churches. Some are actively exploring new ways to become and make better disciples for Christ. They are alive in the Spirit and actively seeking deeper relationships with God and Christ. Some have completely forgotten why they are a church." So, we have two ends to the continuum. Those who are ACTIVE and those who are INACTIVE. Where does CVUMC fall? What do we do about becoming far more ACTIVE?

The conversation that could be held in very small groups or very large groups in our Church is that of faith. Where do we stand individually and as a congregation?

I challenge us to speak of "salvation" and "evangelism."

We are different but just need to get back on the track that Christ wants us on, "To make disciples for Him."

A pastor described Ash Wednesday as the point you can pinch in the middle of a long piece of ribbon, such that when you lift it high, the two ends — one symbolizing our baptism and the other, our funeral — meet and touch.
