A Word from Pastor Bob

What better story to engage during Black History month than the story of Phillip and the Ethiopian Eunuch. Acts 8:26-40.

It appears the Lord spoke to Phillip to go to a certain road and there he met this Ethiopian Eunuch. This man employed by his Queen had gone to Jerusalem to worship God. Most scholars agree he was turned away because he was a eunuch. Damaged goods in the eyes of church (temple) law. Disappointed by his journey he was sitting in his chariot reading from the Book of Isaiah. "Like a sheep he was led to slaughter and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he didn't open his mouth. In his humiliation justice was taken away from him. Who can tell the story of his descendants because his life was taken from the earth?"

After Phillip approached him and heard his story the Eunuch had cried out, "How can I understand these things with no one to teach me?" Phillip explained the Good News of Jesus Christ and when they came to some water Phillip baptized him.

We get to take away a couple of very important things pertinent to our Christian faith. First off we all need a mentor. A spiritual guru if you will who will help us in understanding the twists and turns of the Testaments (Hebrew and Christian). It could be a pastor, a friend or a study group to be involved in.

Second and maybe the most important. All of God's peoples are of sacred worth and valued in the eyes of God. No One Is Turned Away! No One. We may not seem alike, but we are of sacred worth in the eyes of God. We may not look alike, talk alike, or have different customs but we are all of sacred worth in the eyes of God. We may disagree on various things, but we are all of sacred worth in the eyes of the Lord. Did I say we are all of sacred worth in the eyes of God? February is always viewed as the "Love Month' as many will celebrate Valentine's Day. How about keeping the fire of Jesus' teaching and the "Love" of God alive every day in our lives!


