Finance

It looks as though we are nearing the end of the COVID era and I hope we are able to return to a more normal life style.

At this time, I would like to bring up the status of the Church's finances. Currently the Church is just in the black. But compared to 2020, we are possibly approaching a financial strain.

Last year the Church received \$16,100 to supplement the church payroll expenses from a PPP loan, \$10,000 from the Conference for payroll expenses, and \$5,000 for our church technical upgrade to be able to do real time steaming of our services. There were also some individual members who provided donations for the technical upgrade. We thank them.

With the dollar influxes in 2020 we were able to end the year in the black. However, overall congregational giving did not stay strong mainly due to the limitations placed on the Church by the COVID restrictions.

Currently, the Finance committee is in the process of developing the church budget for 2022 and finding that without the external influx of income in the past, we may have a difficult time meeting our projected budget expenses.

So, we are looking to the congregation to step up and meet their pledges and donations for the remainder of the year. As a reminder, and is typical for the summer months, giving declines due to a drop in attendance caused by members traveling and taking vacations.

About mid-July, the church will be sending out giving statements that show your giving for the first half of 2021. We ask that you review it and see how you stand. We would hope that you can make up the giving if you are not current. And, if you have the ability, consider giving an extra amount to help the church to maintain its financial health. If we all chip in, it will make the difference. I thank you for your attention and consideration to our situation.

In the Lord's name we pray for a healthy future, and give thanks for what we have received. And, if you travel, have a safe and good time!
