I would like to take this opportunity to give my impressions of the Desert Southwest Annual Conference 2021.

With the rapid expansion of people being vaccinated and all the safe practices that have been going on this past year, there is an air of anticipation and excitement that we will be meeting in person for most, if not all, conferences, meetings, etc. That will include the annual "Gathering" in Tucson of clergy, Annual Conference 2022, General Conference 2022, and all the conferences that normally meet in person.

Bishop Bob Hoshibata will retire in October this year. To fill the space between his retirement and the election of a new Bishop for our conference, Grant Hagyia will be the interim Bishop for Cal Pac and the Desert Southwest Conferences. Subject to change.

I was particularly pleased when the Dream Team reported on a shift in the local church becoming the hub in Methodist tradition and the conference will support churches as opposed to that which is the opposite at this moment. We have already experienced a little of this as we were given support from the conference in our Covid-19 and Technology grants. 
