# <u>A Word from Pastor Bob</u>

### Celebrations...

Greetings to all in the Name of Christ,

Monday, November 1<sup>st</sup> is this year's date for All Saints Day. We will celebrate the date October 31<sup>st</sup> during worship. We remember the saints who have gone on before and allow that memory of their faith to spur us on to deeper worship and greater service to the Lord. It is also known as All Hallows' Day, or Hallow Mass. Originally it was a Christian celebration in honor of all the saints from Christian history. We still honor all the historical saints but we also honor the saints among us who have passed this past year.

Are you curious about what a saint is? You, we, are all saints. Giving ourselves to Jesus brings us into the communion of saints. As followers of Christ we do believe in the spiritual connection between those in heaven and those on earth. It reminds us of our connectedness as Christians.

And speaking of Halloween! Did you know that Halloween started out as a holy Christian celebration. Hallow, in Old English means "holy" or "sacred." "Hallows' Eve," or "Halloween" means "the evening of holy persons," or the evening before "All Hallows' Day," All Saints Day.
