
COME ONE, COME ALL!

9:00 am before the worship service.



Did You Know?

The United Methodist Church designates a number of Special Sundays throughout the year for recognizing and supporting particular ministries. Special Sundays fall into three different categories:

- Churchwide Special Sundays with offerings
- Special Sundays approved for Annual Conference Offerings
- Special Sundays without offerings

Your Missions Team will evaluate and designate these days for our church.

How can a farmer plant 10 apple trees in five rows with four trees in row?

Answer: By planting in the shape of a star.

Draw a pentagon (five-sided figure) and "plant" one tree at each point.

To each side of the pentagon, add a triangle with a tree at its tip,
You now have five "rows" that intersect to form a five-point star.

Think before You Click: Look for the HTTPS. Before completing an online purchase, make sure the website is security enabled by looking for URLs with https:// at the beginning. The "s" stands for secure and means the website is using encryption to help keep your information protected. There will also be a padlock icon to the left of the URL in the address bar. If you are using an unsecure server (HTTP) or using a public wireless network, do not share personal information such as a credit card number.
