Honor your leaders in the Lord's work—look for ways to cooperate with Christian leadership and help them achieve their goals for your group.

Show leaders respect—hold back your critical comments about those in a position of responsibility. Take the time to say thanks.

<u>Live peacefully with others</u>—search for ways to get along with others; promote peace by living peacefully.

Warn those who are lazy in their Christian walk—ask someone to join you in a Christian ministry such as a service ministry.


Encourage those who are timid—remind them God promises to be their source of power and strength. Partner with them in projects to build their confidence.


