# Lenten Study "The Lord's Prayer"

Our Lenten Study this year will be Adam Hamilton's study on the Lord's Prayer. As I was in preparation, it certainly gave me pause to begin thinking in a deeper way on what the prayer means to me and to each of us. Have we said it so many times it just becomes a rote prayer? Do we mouth the words or do our hearts reach deep into what has been expressed through the ages and does it have any depth in our public and personal worship? Pastor Hamilton reminds us there is no other prayer that is more important to Christians than the Lord's Prayer. In his introduction Hamilton tells us how each word is saturated with meaning, a meaning we often miss as we pray it over and over by rote. As we read the book that accompanies this prayer, Adam Hamilton recites the many ways he uses the Lords Prayer. He recalls personal use and pastoral care in using this prayer. Many times with amazing results. Personally I can say I have used this prayer at the bedside of many parishioners in deep turmoil or those passing from this life to the next. As I reflect on these times I seem to hear God's Spirit speaking to me to use it more often. Now I don't consider myself to be one of those healers that lay hands on people who are sick and find them instantly healed. Although I will lay hands and pray. The results vary and usually it is too personal to relate the stories. I have the same feelings about the Lord's Prayer. In both scenarios I am reminded that it is God who heals and I am merely a humble conduit in the process. In one of my appointments I was called to the beside of a parishioner who lay comatose in the hospital from diabetic complications and was not expected to live much longer. After what seemed like miles of hall ways and various floors I arrived at her bedside. For once I was at a total loss for words. I gently held her hand. The only words that came to mind were the Lord's Prayer. And that is what I did. I leaned in close and prayed the prayer. The next day her husband called me with the news she was awake and doing very well. The only response I have is that when we get out of the way and let God do God's thing miracles happen. I will never forget that, and other times, I simply prayed the Lord's Prayer. God took over and great things happened. I encourage everyone to attend this study throughout Lent or at the very least pick up one of the books from the office and read it with an open mind and an open heart. I am reminded that God is Good and "All things are possible through God."

So, as we ponder the above, keep in mind we are all God's children. We love, we forgive, we are thankful, we are able to follow in His footsteps, we do His will, all in His name.




