Chino Valley United Methodist Car Show

It is that time of year for the Antique and Classic Car Show, Saturday, October 1 from 2 pm to 5 pm. To date the church has had over 15 annual cars shows with the first show bringing in 24 cars. Nancy Mitchell, Janet Bailey and the Missions Committee organized the first show.

The year before COVID, the car show grew to 85 cars. We were able to get back in the groove last year with enhancements and look forward to this year as one to remember.

One of the highlights of the show this year is partnering with the Chino Valley Memorial Foundation which brings awareness to the 9/11 memorial. Larry Holt, CEO, will be grilling hot dogs and have chips and sodas to help the foundation. They will be located close to the Ice Cream Social coordinated by Joyce Wise and "Official Ice Cream Scoopers" Girl Scout Troup 4536.

Trustee's Ministry

One important task of the Trustees is keeping the church property looking nice. This year, it has been a challenge with all of the monsoon rains. It seems like it has been a summer of WEEDS, WEEDS, and MORE WEEDS! The Trustees are working hard to control the weeds and keep the bushes trimmed, but until monsoon season ends, you may notice more weeds or un-trimmed bushes than you usually see at church on Sunday.

The Trustees want to thank everyone who volunteered to spray / weed-eat weeds and trim bushes. Also, a special thanks to church member Pete Mensing for all his hard work mowing the weeds and grass on our church property.

In our August Trustees meeting, the Trustees voted to install solar LED security lights around the outside of the Church. They will be positioned so they light up the Church, Remp Hall, and parking lot at night. A security alarm system is built in the church, but Remp Hall and storage buildings only have locks on the doors. The new outside LED lights will provide an extra layer of security on our church property.

We recently signed a new facility use agreement with the Rancho Vista Home Owners Association. They will be using Remp Hall for their HOA board meetings / annual meetings. The Girl Scouts Troop, and TOPS currently use Remp Hall for their meetings. The Chino Valley Lioness Club have their bi-monthly meetings in our Church multi-purpose room.

Trustees projects scheduled for this fall include adding more gravel to the low spots in the parking lot, installing new handicap signs, repainting the handicap symbols in the concrete parking, and repairs to the outside of Remp Hall.

The Landscape Committee, part of the Trustees, and Trustees met to discuss how best to improve the area after the rose garden was removed. Two brick engraving companies were contacted and the pros and cons of each were reviewed at the meeting. After careful consideration Bricks R Us was chosen with the consensus they would fit the use planned for the area. As memory bricks are installed, the area will be transformed into an area to relax and reflect, serve as a fellowship area and perhaps when weather permits an area for outdoor church. Although the Reflection Patio committee decided the engraved bricks were priced reasonably at \$60.00 for the 4 x 8 brick and \$80.00 for the 8 x 8 brick.
