## A Note from the Lay Leader



Can you believe November is here? All Saints Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving, elections, crisp brisk mornings, apple cider and hot cocoa...... and yes let's start getting ready for Christmas!

One day I thought about how we support each other and how that support affects how we look at and react to things.

Asking God "why" is normal when the unthinkable happens. We might not ask God why in the moment of crisis because we are trying to hold together the pieces of life as we know it. Even if we are grounded in faith for years, hard circumstances bring the "why." We are not asking why God allows suffering, but rather why is this happening to me?

Some of the most faithful asked God why in suffering. The prophet Habakkuk asked, "Why do you make me look at injustice? "Why do you tolerate wrongdoing?" (Habakkuk 1:3) Even Jesus, from the cross, asked, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? (Matthew 27:46).

Instead of always asking "why me?" Ask....

- 1. What now?
- 2. What can I learn from this?
- 3. Why not me?
- 4. How can I praise you in this storm?

Scripture indicates God's way of thinking is totally different than our own. By asking "what?" instead of "why?' it puts God back on His throne. Asking "what?" suggests humility, trusting God. It's not always easy. It requires a mindset shift, an intentional decision to trust that God is teaching us something and that is for our ultimate good and the good of others around us, that we can impact others with what we've been learning. Yes, our needs are important but maybe, just maybe asking some of those questions may bring peace to our troubles and help others along the way. We must always be thankful.

Thanksgiving is about togetherness and gratitude. The true measure of blessings is not what we say, but rather how we use our blessings.
