

Also, the Trustees want to give a special thanks to everyone who volunteered to help clean to church during the search for a new custodian. You did a great job and we appreciate your hard work.

One of the Trustees projects for 2022, was cleaning out and re-organizing the three storage sheds on the north side of the church. Over time, they have collected a lot of dust and dirt, and have become so cluttered that you could barely get into the building without climbing over something. In late November, several of the Trustees cleaned out the storage shed next to the church. All of the round tables that were stored in Remp Hall, and the fold-up metal chairs are now stored in this shed. The clean-out of the other two sheds will be done when the weather permits.

We have three upcoming events in January which includes the set-up / takedown. Finance

Greeting for the New Year! (I'm wondering where the last year went...)

Financially, the Church has done quite well in 2022. There have been a number of expense increases, mainly: Church Property and Liability insurance, utilities and kitchen expenses.

A new expense line has been added to the church budget for 2023 that supports the Trustees, who are the caretakers of the church building and property. It may not be readily known, the Trustees do not have a steady source of income. So long as the church monthly income is steady, the general fund of the church will transfer \$1,500 quarterly to the Trustees. This will greatly aid the cost of large unexpected expenses and for possible future growth.

The 2023 budget process went well with Carrie Cattabriga, our church treasurer, taking the lead. In considering the above expense increases, plus an across the board salary increase for church employees, the hiring of a custodian beginning for the new year, the 2023 budget is about 8% higher than 2022.

The good news, through the Stewardship drive ending in November, pledges are the same as last year. Pledges now represent 48% of our church income. Sunday church givings represent 25%, the remainder comes from other church facility user fees.

A positive report is that our church saving has been slowly increasing. This should help us get though any unpredicted difficult times. If you are interested in viewing the church budget or our monthly expenses, please contact me. Financial Reports are available.
