February Notes from the Lay Leader

A special month for sweethearts, the little critter peeking its head out hoping to give us a decision on the weather for the next few weeks and most notable is the beginning of our 40 day journey on Ash Wednesday, February 22.

February is also Black History month. Have you ever watched the movie "Hidden Figures?"

The story of a team of female African-American mathematicians who served a vital role in NASA during the early years of the U.S. space program. The film, set at NASA Langley Research Center in 1961, depicts segregated facilities such as the West Area Computing unit, where an all-Black group of female mathematicians were originally required to use separate dining and bathroom facilities. However, in reality, one of the women, Dorothy Vaughan was promoted to supervisor of West Computing much earlier, in 1949, becoming the first Black supervisor at the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics (NACA).

Kevin Costner plays the role of head administrator for the NASA program and puts his faith in these women. He saw no color. The mathematician skills of the lady who ensured the space flight for John Glenn was accurate was astounding. Every day rain or shine she had to go over 1/2 mile to a "colored" restroom. Costner wanted to know where she went every day for 45 minutes? She finally had the courage to say there are no restrooms in this building for

colored folks. Well, he saw to it right then and there to change that!

Diverging to another topic (stay with me) the latest at our house, is an opportunity to have a bit of fun. Late October, the garden produced volunteer tomato plants. We decided to put one in a pot and bring it in the house. Little did we know it was an indeterminate tomato. What ???

Indeterminate tomatoes grow to be quite large and tall spreading their vines. As you can tell our plant is well over 8 feet tall. Our longhorn horns and string provide the needed staking. The opposite—determinate tomatoes grow to a predetermined height, about four feet tall.



How does the Hidden Figures story and intermediate tomatoes relate you ask??

Sipping coffee in the early hours I sit and gaze at the tomato plant. It is getting taller with longer vines. The fruit is multiplying and getting ripe. Can we compare our Christian faith and journey to growing and spreading the word, knowing no bounds? Can we see each other as equals with no barrier of race or color, but rather acceptance and love? The movie and tomato plant give me hope. Plus the tomatoes are yummy!

We are currently developing a list of projects for this coming year and welcome suggestions for new projects. Let us know.

A couple projects slated for this year is adding additional gravel to our parking lot and repaint the handicap symbols on the concrete parking area. Both are scheduled for this spring.

Ongoing projects are organizing the outside sheds for more usability, updating irrigation, and someone to take care of grounds maintenance.

In 2022 we increased the number of groups using Remp Hall. Currently, the Girl Scouts, TOPS, and Rancho Vista HOA meet for scheduled meetings. The Chino Valley Lioness Club continues to meet in the church multi-purpose room.

Unfortunately, Remp Hall is poorly insulated, and has an outdated electric heating / cooling system. Due to an unusually cold winter, we are experiencing some very high electric bills for heating the building. The Trustees are currently exploring ways to reduce this cost and still utilize the building.

The custodial position is outsourced to Merry Maids. A special thank you to those who volunteered and stepped to help clean the church.

We have many events planned for the year. January started with set-up / takedown for the January 5 Vitalant Blood Drive and the January 14 Celebration of Life for Jan Mauck with refreshments in Remp Hall. The Life Line Screening scheduled for January 12 was canceled due to the lack of medical staff to run the event.

From the Finance Committee – Anita MacFadden

Those of us dealing with finances can get caught up in the dollars and cents of the job, neglecting to look at the bigger picture of why we are here. First and foremost we are here to spread the gospel, tell the good news of Jesus Christ.

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth and all that is in it. Psalm 24:1 says "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it." God then created man to take care of it, to be stewards, managers of what is his. "Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful." (1 Cor 4:2) It is our responsibility to learn how to take care of what is his.

For us here at CVUMC, this means we need to take care of our member's and guest's spiritual needs, physical needs as we congregate, and look outwardly to care for the needs of others. As the Finance Team it is our responsibility to make sure that the financial contributions you make are used to meet our mission. As members of CVUMC your (and ours) responsibility is to reflect on where you are in spiritual walk with God as stewards of all that God has given you.

So how are we doing? We finished 2022 in the black and had a successful Stewardship Campaign with 30 pledges, one more than last year. However, we are already seeing higher expenses as compared to last year in electricity and insurance.

As I close, I am reminded of Paul's teachings from 2 Corinthians 8:12 - "For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what he does not have."

I would like to ask you to prayerfully consider how you are answering God's call to be a steward of what he has given you and how you can help our church be a light unto the community within the capabilities that you have. It may be through participation in one of the small groups, participation in choir, volunteering on one of our committees or in the office and giving of your finances.

This is an excerpt from Birch's book:

Nobody wants to be Jeremiah, who lived through God's judgement on his culture. But looking at our own culture today, we may have more in common with Jeremiah than we'd like. How do we stand for righteousness and still relate to an ungodly world? In the stories of Jeremiah's life and times, we see God's reckless love and offer of forgiveness. They are stories of hope for our day and encouragement for our lives.

Children's Sunday School

The bible verse we are focusing on right now is: "This is truly the prophet who is coming into the world." (John 6:14b).

Over the next few weeks we are learning about important people who believed in Jesus and what that means for our lives today as we follow Jesus. Our children have been talking about how, as followers of Jesus, we are called to invite others in, just as Jesus invited people to be his disciples.



You might have noticed applications for Kairos Outside in the Narthex. These weekends provide an opportunity for guests to connect with others in like circumstances and to experience God's love through Christian fellowship.

A Kairos Outside Weekend is a no-cost retreat, hosted by a Christian community, for women who now have (or have had) relatives and/or friends in State and Federal prisons, jails, youth facilities, or who have been incarcerated themselves but were unable to attend a Kairos Inside Weekend. These women are shown Christ's love and treated as Guests of Kairos Outside. To attend, Guests do not need to be Christian. Weekends are usually held twice per year and last from Friday evening until Sunday afternoon. The next upcoming weekend is in May in Flagstaff. 
