

A Word from Pastor Bob

"Lent & Holy Week Journey..."

Greetings to all in the name of Christ,

Let's first start off with our journey through Lent through Holy Week. We have had our Ash Wednesday service to start the 6 weeks of Lent that leads us into Holy Week. I will be leading a Lenten Study starting on March 7 ending April 4. Both morning and evening classes will be held on Tuesdays. The morning study will begin at 10 am and the evening study will begin at 6 pm. Books are available in the office. The study is by Adam Hamilton, Luke: Jesus and the Outsiders, Outcast, and Outlaws.

Holy week services are Palm Sunday, April 2. Holy Thursday service is April 6 at 6 pm, and Good Friday service is April 7 at 6 pm. We will be doing a Tenebrae service for Good Friday. Easter is April 9 with a 6:30 am sunrise service and our main service will be at 10 am.

I have been meditating on the words from our Ash Wednesday prayer reminding us that God is our source and the grounding element of our whole being. It is in the relationship we have in God that we live, move and exist. Lent can be a time of focus on eliminating all the negative actions in our lives as individuals and corporate gatherings such as our churches and community gatherings. It is a time to turn around (justification) one more time to become the best we can be in all things. My Lenten prayer is that each and everyone of us can find the very best in each of us as we lift up our churches and communities in all that we do. Now, I have found in the six years I have lived in Chino Valley that aside from March coming and going as a lion or a lamb, March can be an unexpected month. By that I mean, we are settling into the expectations that spring is here and then we can still have a snow storm that can upset what we are engaging in. Planting gardens, planting and all the different aspects of our yards. (Have you guessed I like gardening and landscaping?) The one thing that occupies my mind is that even in unexpected situations we do have hope. Hope that things will get better. I look at Jesus this way. We have hope that we as fellow travelers on this life journey, this Christian walk, we always have hope that God is doing a new thing, Jesus has given us incredible blueprints for an outstanding life and God's Spirit is moving within and around us all the time. Notes from the Lay Leader

March! The way the weather has been the last few months the first day of Spring will be welcomed with open arms.

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. The season of Lent is a preparing for the celebration of Easter.

We once again highlight his triumphal entry into Jerusalem to the upper room....to the garden....to the Cross....and then to the tomb. All this reflection and study is laying the groundwork for celebrating once again our Easter Joy and resurrection life.

Holy Week begins with the celebration of Palm / Passion Sunday to celebrate Jesus the King's triumphal entry into Jerusalem and the days that lead up to the Passion of Jesus which we commemorate on Friday of Holy Week.

On Maundy Thursday, Christians commemorate the supper Jesus shared with his disciples before his crucifixion, when Jesus washed the disciples' feet and instituted the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. The ancient practice of stripping the Lord's table and sanctuary following communion is a vivid and dramatic way of showing the desolation and abandonment of the long night in Gethsemane and what followed. This begins Holy Triduum or 3 Great Days; Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil (which is celebrated on Saturday evening).

On Good Friday, Christians around the world hear the proclamation of the full Passion of Christ. The focus of this service is the suffering and sacrifice that Jesus willingly took upon himself in order that all may have new life.

As we journey down God's paths together during Lent, let us look for and discover the myriad of ways in which we are becoming more faithful in our prayer life, in our discipleship, in our faith-filled belief and our actions in Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit who brings New Life to all.

Trustees

Greetings from the Trustees.

We have had some problems this winter regulating the temperature in the library. The library is always cold, and never seems to warm up. Meanwhile, the Sunday school room gets warm to almost hot.

Recently, we contacted one of the local heating and cooling companies. Based on their inspection, the furnace is working properly, and there are no leaks or collapsed ducts in the attic. They did find that the vanes on the ceiling vent in the Sunday school room are aimed toward the thermostat. When the heat comes on, hot air blows on the thermostat. This causes the thermostat temperature to rise, and prematurely shuts the heat off.

They made some adjustments to resolve this issue, and offered some additional recommendations for the Trustees to implement.

At our February Trustees meeting, we formed a sub-committee to evaluate the condition of the heating and cooling system in Remp Hall, and make recommendations on what, if any, repairs or updates can be done to reduce electrical usage. They will present their findings at the March Trustees meeting.

You may have noticed some heavy equipment clearing brush, and other activities on the vacant property west of the Church. It is our understanding that the property owner is moving forward with developing this property. The Trustees plan to send a representative to the next Planning and Zoning Commission meeting to get an update on development plans.

The Trustees don't have many projects scheduled for March. However, April will be a busy month with the Craft and Bake sale, LifeLine Screening Thursday, April 20 and Vitalant Blood Drive Friday, April 21.

Prayer Circle

The Prayer Circle meets every Thursday at 9:00 in the sanctuary.

All are invited to come and have a conversation with God. Silence is vital during prayer because it allows us to be still and let God speak to us. It also lets us focus on what He has already said in His Word.

Our entire being is on holy ground. We are made to be still. It is our resting place, and this is where we come home to ourselves.

Whenever we turn within through prayer in silence, God is waiting for us with open arms, waiting to embrace us, waiting to fill us with divine love and peace beyond all understanding.

Silence helps us enter God's presence Sometimes, it's hard to hear God's voice when we are talking all the time. It is much easier when we are silent before Him.

By being silent in prayer, you can enter into God's presence. The Bible says, "Be still and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10). You can know that He is truthfully present, and you feel your chances will be more to enter with Him.

It is a simple and powerful way to connect with God because He wants us to seek Him and listen for His voice through the silence that is in our lives.

While silence in prayer may seem like an uncommon thing to do at first, if you practice regularly, you may receive plenty of benefits from it. Silence is not just about stopping talking; it is about creating an environment of listening. Silence invites God to speak to us. The more time we spend in silence, the more we experience God's presence.

It's amazing how easily our minds can wander during silent prayer. But if we can learn to quiet our minds and hearts before God, He will fill the void with His love, truth, and grace.


