

Nerdy Notes



"INCREDIBLE: \$69 Military Invention Turns Men 40+ Into Beasts!"

I have never clicked on that link, or one like it, but I bet I know what I'd get if I did: some crazy sales pitch that I would have a hard time resisting, even though I'm not a man, and I don't want to be a beast!

No, seriously, I know you've seen them, too. They're called "clickbait" – advertisements or articles that seem so unbelievable, exciting, mysterious, or enticing that one can't help but click on them. Although annoying, they're probably harmless. According to GeoEdge Security (https://www.geoedge.com/q1-ad-quality-2023-report/), "Based on GeoEdge's March 2023 survey of global Digital Media and Ad Ops professionals, 70% of respondents believed that ad security incidents occur at a rate of 1/1,000." They go on to estimate, however, that: the situation is more severe with incidents occurring at:

US: 1/170
UK: 1/140
Canada: 1/200
Germany: 1/300
Japan: 1/1000

Some of the attacks that are precipitated by clickbait are gift card scams, fake antiviruses and cleaners, forced browser notifications, malicious extensions and add-ons, misleading product offers, and others. Phishing schemes, both direct and indirect, are among the biggest reasons to entice you to click on the unbelievable links, so be sure to protect your personal information from these people who are trying so hard to get it.

One more thing: if you think that your favorite newspaper, network, or other site will only give you the "best" ads, you are wrong. Most legitimate sites will check their advertisers' offerings fairly rigorously, but only at the beginning. Once the advertiser has checked out ok, then the company accepting their advertising revenue stops checking and the advertiser is free to change their ads as they wish. That's why the Arizona Republic's website is so full of clickbait ads, because they have a huge stable of advertisers, and they don't have time to check them all repeatedly.

So, now you know! If a link seems especially juicy, that's the perfect reason NOT to click on it. Don't give the bad guys any help getting your valuable information; they seem to be succeeding just fine on their own!

Stewardship of Time

1Peter 4:10

And serve each other according to the gift each person has received, as good managers of God's diverse gifts.

Time stewardship - the careful, wise, and Godly use of the time God gives us. We need to accept the time given to us and decide what we will fill it with.

Several Sundays ago, Pastor Bob talked about Time is Love. This resonated with me in relation to Stewardship of Time, and a Hallmark movie I had just seen – both of which I had not recognized the connection between Time and Love. God using Pastor Bob's sermon hit me up side the head!

Time is Love! In the movie, the guy leaves his cellphone on the train after flirting with the girl in the seat across from him. The girl finds it and gets his permission to get to know him through his phone contacts, learning the following about him:

- When a boy, his mother was killed on Valentine's Day. They had been creating valentines
 and the last one said Love More than Anything.
- The boy meets girl, they connect and years later they get engaged. Then she gets in an accident, loses her memory and falls in love with her therapist. The boy lets her go.
- The young man meets a waitress and listens to her as she explains how she is terrible at her job and how she loves taking care of dogs. She gets fired. The young man helps her get connected with a dog rescue and she finds her purpose in life.
- The young man steps in to take care of his dad who he has been estranged from since his mother died. In doing so they reconnect through shared experience.
- The young man meets the neighbors and learns that there are times that the single mom needs help watching her son. The young man steps in to help, learning that the son loves music. The young man helps by providing a piano and teaching him to play.

There's more, but do you see where I am going with this? This young man spent Time with people, listening to them, acknowledging them, and supporting them to help them to succeed. In taking the time to know these people, this young man showed each of them love, more than anything. Time is Love!

God wants us to be like this young man. Be good stewards of our time and the opportunities that God provides us to show people love. Time is Love!
