## Finance

Greetings from Finance and welcome to fall. The temperature has sure changed! But, it beats the hot summer we've had.

The church is doing financially well. We have been in the black for most of 2023, however, there were months in the red. Our church pledges are healthy.

Beginning Sunday, November 5 we start our annual Stewardship campaign for 2024. We will have three congregation members explain why they give and what it means to them. We will also have third quarter giving statements, handouts about stewardship, and pledge cards.

If you do not usually pledge, please consider doing so. By pledging, we can have a better idea for our church budget input which helps manage our expenses.

There are some challenging expenses coming up for 2024 that we must prepare for. As we all know, our church membership is made up of a lot of elder senior citizens that are not able to physically help in the church as they have in the past. So the church has taken a pro-active approach to the upkeep and maintenance of our church and grounds.

- 1. Merry Maids was hired to do routine and detailed cleaning. Their schedule is to come in every other week. The cost is \$300.00 a month.
- 2. Chino's Landscaping was hired to maintain the outside appearance of the Church which includes general landscape maintenance; general cleanup, weed whacking and weed spraying, tree and bush trimming. Their schedule is monthly from March—November. The cost is \$400 a month.

In addition Arizona Power Service (APS) has increased electrical monthly level pay by \$100.00 a month.

Therefore, you can see we will be facing a challenging financial year in 2024. As I mentioned previously, please consider pledging and hopefully you are able to increase your annual giving for 2024. Every bit helps!

Remember, all we have received comes from the Lord. We can give back to the church with our service and giving.
