I came upon a phrase awhile back—“Do they see the Jesus in me”? and it piqued my interest. So Google here we come

Here is a short version of an article written July 22, 2020 by Jim Smith.

Letting ourselves see Jesus in us: it’s something that we are certainly called to do. It’s not always easy to do, if we’re honest with ourselves and with each other. Cindi McMenammin wrote the a list of 5 ways that you and I can let others see Jesus in us.

1. Show Grace

Show grace and not a critical spirit. We are called to a person’s heart. It’s a heart that Jesus died for, but our critical spirits, don’t display Jesus in us—they display the flesh in us.

2. Be Willing to be at the Bottom

This goes against the culture we live in. It’s human nature to want to be somebody special or always bragging. Even to be somebody special who’s a Christian...but Jesus never did that. He insisted that His father receive the praise and glory. Jesus showed us that the way up was down.

3. Be Holy Instead of Hurried

We don’t have to go through life with a “holier than thou” attitude. We are called to do the opposite. We are called to slow down long enough to hear God’s voice and to notice people around us, to say a kind word, and to serve others. Concentrate on being holy, not hurried.

4. Don’t Worry

This one isn’t easy, either. When we get gobbled up in worry, we’re showing people around us that we believe we’re in control.

5. Be Zealous For God’s Glory and Truth

This is the one that might make others a little uncomfortable. It’s what also made people around Jesus uncomfortable. If people are really going to see Jesus in you and in me, they are sometimes going to need to see a zealotness for the glory and truth of God. Don’t be afraid to challenge someone who is claiming to come in the name of God, but who is preaching a different gospel or about how they are oppressing other people, or call out religious talk.


