From Advent to Easter we took a trip through the entire book of Matthew, and along the way we were challenged by Jesus' call to bring the Kingdom of Heaven to earth by showing love to others and making peace in our world. We were also constantly reminded of God's deep love for each of us - I really enjoyed learning and growing along with you!

Soon, we will close Matthew and start our next series, which I am going to call "House Rules."

Every house has some House Rules - ways that we agree to live together so we don't drive each other crazy. Do you remember moving out of your childhood home and having roommates for the first time? This is often a rocky change for young adults - did you find good rules for how to live together? What about now - what are the "House Rules" that have worked well for your home?

News from the Leadership Board Anita MacFadden – Leadership Chair

The Leadership Board (LB) met Sunday May 4. I hope you find these summaries helpful in understanding what the Leadership Board is doing. If you ever have any questions, please talk to any of the Board Members or Pastor Kevin.

Leadership Development

For the next several meetings the LB is reviewing the handout *Wearing Four Hats, Understanding the Leadership Board's Roles in SAS.*

The Trustees "Hat" was discussed by the members with the following key points:

- The LB collectively holds the responsibilities of the Trustees.
- The LB is responsible for creating and maintaining a framework that ensures the church's property and legal obligations are effectively managed.
 - 1. Legal & fiduciary oversight
 - 2. Risk & insurance management
 - 3. Property and asset stewardship
 - Oversight of facility operations
- The LB does not handle building maintenance themselves. The newly formed Building Maintenance Team is empowered to do building and grounds maintenance.

Policies and Procedures

The LB is currently reviewing and updating church policies as well as identifying those needing to be written for more clarity in specific areas.

A Gift Acceptance Policy was created and approved by LB for gifts received by donors . A copy is available from Anita, Pastor Kevin or Sandy.

March 2025 Financials

In March our income was slightly less than our expenses. Expenses are up by \$2,413.00. For the current year our balance is a negative (\$2,007.02).

As compared to March 2024 / end, income is down by \$6,692,.00 primarily due to a decrease in pledged giving.

The Church will be purchasing bibles for the high school graduates who have supported our church activities. Congratulations to those graduates.

<u>Update on Goal 2 Developing Vision and Core Values</u>

We have started the visioning for our church space, including Remp Hall, the classrooms, and the play area. Look for more to come on this.

At our next meeting we will be discussion how to move our church from Preservation Mode to Momentum Growth mode. This will have impact on our visioning related to church spaces.



This book provides a brief summary of the major doctrines shared in the Wesleyan family of denominations and organizes the material into systematic categories: doctrine of revelation, doctrine of God, doctrine of Christ, doctrine of the Spirit, doctrine of humanity, doctrine of the "way of salvation", doctrine of the church and means of grace, and doctrine of things to come. In this book Methodist Doctrine—The Essentials he outlines historical doctrinal consensus in American Episcopal Methodist Churches in a comparative and ecumenical dialogue with the doctrinal inheritance of other major families of the Christian tradition.
