News from the Leadership Board Anita MacFadden

The primary work of the Leadership Board is to help the church live into Jesus' call to go and make disciples, to carry out our mission to love God and serve our community, and to develop systems and boundaries to allow the day-to-day operations of the church to run smoothly. So, what have we been doing?

We continue to look to the future and how God is calling us to serve the community. This involves discussions on what is the WHY for Chino Valley United Methodist Church. WHY is a purpose, cause or belief. It is the very reason that we as a church exist. For us, it is understanding and articulating our WHY in the context of Jesus' call to go and make disciples. Once we have our WHY, we will review How we are doing things and What those things are.

Additionally, we are talking about New Possibilities that serve the community and provide a steady income stream to the church. Initial studies are being done to determine the feasibility of building low-income housing on the vacant land behind the church. There are a lot of things to consider so it will take us a while before a proposal can be developed and brought to the church membership.

Our next meeting is Sunday July 28 at about 11:15 am in the multipurpose room. All are welcome to come and watch the work of the board.

Business of the Church Anita MacFadden

The Leadership Board also manages the business of the church, the primary functions of Council, Trustees, Finance and SPR.

In the Trustee function we have several projects recently completed and/or underway. These include the following:

Sanctuary

Replaced the incandescent bulbs with LED bulbs

Fixed the electrical issues with the ceiling fans and replaced the fan controls

• Bell Tower - Updated electrical to the bell tower light

Received 3 bids on replacing the 3 oldest AC units, including updating the controls

Applied for a Deferred Maintenance Grant from the Conference to help with the expenses

Irrigation System

Received a bid on replacing the current system

Applied for a Deferred Maintenance Grant from the Conference to help with the expenses

• Fire Suppression System

Approved work to get the kitchen suppression system and kitchen hood updated

Purchased new fire extinguishers to replace those that are out of date

Church Work Team

Looking to create a team to do small handyman jobs, identify maintenance items, obtain quotes and help out with church activities.

Financially speaking, as mentioned above, we have applied for a grant from the conference for deferred maintenance items. The funds will help us offset the costs and allow us to continue to identify other areas that need to be addressed. Additionally, your generosity to the church continues to allow us to provide an inviting atmosphere for Sunday worship and to those in the community who use our facility each week. Thank you!

Sanctuary Preparations

The church will be needing someone who is willing to take over the Sanctuary duties for each Sunday. Terry Colucci, who has been doing this for 20+ years is retiring to the beautiful state of New York to be closer to her family. Below is a list of general instructions in preparing the sanctuary for services.

- Fill candles with paraffin. The fill bottle and paraffin bottle are in the right front closet of the sanctuary. Candles need attention about every three weeks.
- Fill humidifier in piano. The instructions are on the watering can in the front sanctuary closet. Distilled water is used and a capful of conditioner per instructions.
- Hang and change banners as appropriate. General banners are in the right side closet in the sanctuary and special/holiday banners are in the left side. Doves for the memory banner are located and identified in a closet in the multipurpose room.
- There are also seasonal flowers in the multipurpose room to decorate the church. A notebook with pictures of different seasons of the church will be produced for inspiration.

Dear Members of the Church,

I am writing to you on behalf of the Yavapai County Stand Down planning committee. U.S.VETS – Prescott has been the non-profit sponsor of the Yavapai County Homeless Veteran Stand Down since 2006. If you are not familiar with the Stand Down concept, this is an event that is held in cities all over the nation to provide food, clothing, services, and referrals to veterans experiencing homelessness.

The name "Stand Down" comes from a term used in times of war. Exhausted combat units requiring time to rest and recover were removed from the battlefield to a place of relative security and safety. Today, Stand Down refers to a grassroots, community-based intervention program designed to help the nation's estimated 130,000 homeless veterans "combat" life on the streets. The hand-up, not handout philosophy of Stand Down is carried out through the work of hundreds of volunteers and organizations throughout the nation.

This years' Stand Down will be held September 20 & 21, 2024 at our location at 1040 Whipple st. Every year, we reach out to the Quad city faith-based community to consider being part of our Undie Sunday donation drive during the month of August. Undie Sunday is a donation drive to collect new packages of underwear, socks, undershirts, thermals, etc. that can be given to veteran participants of the Stand Down event. Participating faith communities can choose one or all Sundays in August to participate. What you'll need is an empty box for donations and we will provide you with a flyer to use. To let people know about the drive, add the information to your activity calendar, email blast, weekly announcements, or social media. Once the box is full, contact me, Kimberly, at the number below to arrange a pickup.

Stand Down draws the community into the solution, gives hope to veterans, offers them temporary respite and provides information and services that can help end their cycle of homelessness. Thank you for your consideration in assisting with this most important event. Please let me know if you have any questions or would like additional information.
