5 Practices for Fruitful Congregations

During the month of September, we will be working our way through Bishop Robert Schnase's five key practices — radical hospitality, passionate worship, intentional faith development, risk-taking mission and service, and extravagant generosity — as we consider how best to grow our faith while sharing it with those around us.

In the past, the church has functioned on what we call the attractional model, but as we move into what many call the post-Christian era, that is not the case. No longer is Sunday morning set aside for families to "go to church." Society as a whole does not consider church or even Christianity a central part of their lives.

As followers of Christ, we are called to GO and make disciples. We are called to move out of our comfort zones as we find ways to connect with the people in our community. One way we can do this is through Fresh Expressions – where we meet people where they are and love them like Jesus. As relationships are formed, we find many opportunities to share our faith.

So as we work our way through these 5 practices, we will consider what they look like for those who enjoy traditional worship and also what they look like as a Fresh Expression of faith in the community. I hope you will join us on this journey!


Starting Sunday, October 3, at 9 am bring your Bible and prepare to learn about the Book of Luke. Rita Haslett is teaching the class.
