

A Word from Pastor Kevin

"Merry Christmas!"

Hello, CVUMC Friends!

Trees are trimmed! Lights are up! Parking lots are full - Christmas must be coming! I am very excited to be joining you all for Advent, as we love, serve, and sing our way through the season.

There are four books in the Bible that tell the story of Jesus's life - have you noticed that they each tell it differently? It appears that each author had a particular idea of what was important about Jesus's life, and this is reflected in how they tell his story. For instance, the book of Mark is all about action - Mark has no time for waiting for Jesus to grow up and get started, so he skips the birth of Jesus altogether. Luke wants to emphasize how Jesus's birth changes the lives of people around him, so he tells lots of "little" stories about Jesus's extended family, the shepherds, and folks at the Temple. John is a little strange - he describes Jesus's birth in a poem about the cosmic, creative power of God.

For our church, this month, we will be journeying through the story of Jesus's birth as it is told in the book of Matthew. Matthew wants to emphasize that Jesus's birth is the fulfillment of God's promises to the people of Israel - and to the whole world. Matthew knows they have been waiting for thousands of years for the Messiah, and now, he's here!

For us, Matthew will remind us that waiting for the promises of God can be hard, but that, our waiting is not in vain - Jesus comes through, bringing us the gifts of peace, joy, and love.

I look forward to waiting, and celebrating with all of you, this month at CVUMC!

News from the Leadership Board

The primary work of the Leadership Board is to help the church live into Jesus' call to go and make disciples, to carry out our mission to love God and serve our community, and to develop systems and boundaries to allow the day-to-day operations of the church to run smoothly. So, what have we been doing?

We have reordered our meetings to adopt a functional agenda that will keep us focused on Board work. Our November meeting was centered on learning - "What is the work of the Board?" The key points from what we learned are:

- There are four lanes of accountable leadership that need to be filled Ministry, Management, Leadership and Governance.
- The default lane is Management, no matter what size the church is. The most important lanes are Ministry and Governance, which tend to get ignored.
- The Leadership Board is responsible for Governance.
- The Leadership Board = Council + Trustees + SPR + Finance
- The primary functions of Governance are stewardship, generative work, strategy, hold the Pastor and ministries accountable to the vision and goals.
- The Leadership Board should have 6 to 9 members plus the pastor acting in an executive capacity

Our next meeting is Sunday December 1 about 11:15 am in the multipurpose room. We will be approving the 2025 budget and Charge Conference Meeting Minutes for submission to the conference. All are welcome to come and watch the work of the board.

Business of the Church

The Leadership Board also manages the business of the church, the primary functions of Council, Trustees, Finance and SPR.

Financials

Good news! Through September our revenue is 13.6% greater than planned with expenses 2.62% less than planned resulting in a net income of \$13,544.52. Thank you for supporting the ministries of our church.

Mission Accountability – Ministry Goals

Ministry Goals will be one of our primary focuses in 2025. The pastor did include goals in the stewardship handouts. They include the following:

- Time presence and participation of our members
- Talent:
 - Leaders to lead and recruit others
 - Caretakes to make calls, write notes and check in on our folks
 - Hands-on help to make repairs, prepare and welcome guests to worship and host activities
